

EXAMINATION: NATIONAL EXAMINATION

National Uniform Licensing and Certification Examination

The *National Uniform Licensing and Certification Examination* tests a candidate's ability to apply the knowledge and experience they have obtained. Upon approval of their applications, the applicants will receive an eligibility letter from BREa with instructions to schedule the examination.

- A. Applicants must schedule the examination and pay the applicable fee directly to PSI that is the examination administrator in California.
- B. The examination administrator may provide applicants with a California Candidate Handbook, which outlines the examination structure and content, timelines, locations, fees, available special accommodation, and examination rules.
- C. Applicants are allowed five attempts to pass the examination within one year from the date the Bureau issues the eligibility letter. If the application expires, the applicant must submit a new application and pay all applicable fees.
- D. Examination results are only accepted when presented in the official score report issued by the examination administrator.
- E. Examination statistics may be published on the BREa website and newsletter.
